MicroWorld's eScan range of products ensure Anti-virus and Content security for systems.</p> <p>As a Windows user you'll probably be familiar with the messages: 'There is not enough memory to load the registry,' 'Windows has encountered an error accessing the system registry. You should restore the registry now and restart the computer,' and 'If you ignore this error and shut down your system, you may lose data.'</p> <p>Most times there might be no backup copy from which to restore the registry, and where one exists, there is no guarantee that it'll do the job properly. Restoring the registry replaces the faulty registry with a known good backup copy. However, this backup copy may not contain all the information recently added to your system.'</p> <p>Together they constitute a nightmare. A damaged Windows registry can involve reinstalling the operating system (OS). Now, the latest release of MWAV detects errors in the Windows registry.</p> <p>Windows registry is critical to the running of the OS. It is a central repository of links to important system files and OS options and contains information and settings for all the hardware, software, users, and preferences of the computer and the operating system. Whenever a user makes changes to Control Panel settings, file associations, system policies, or installed software, the changes are reflected and stored in the registry. Some applications write to the registry; they do not function properly if their registry entries are damaged.</p> <p>Spyware/Adware use application installations to infiltrate your system and invalidate registry entries. Un-installation and incorrect removal of software also result in invalid file or folder references as well as startup programs orphaned by missing software drivers and invalid shortcuts. However, the most likely cause of damaged registry entries are Spyware, Virus, and Worm attacks. An accumulation of invalid registry entries can slow down the PC, cause it to generate error messages, prevent programs from functioning properly and result in the system becoming unstable and eventually crashing.</p> <p>MWAV is now equipped to detect and clean registry errors caused by viruses and spyware, and improve system performance and stability.
